**An Ordinance Amending Chapter 16 Entitled “Water and Sewer”  
Section 18 Entitled “Rates” To Increase The Sewer Rates For Sewer  
Users Who Do Not Also Receive Water From The Village Of Folsom To  
Thirty (\$30) Dollars Per Residential Customer And Fifty (\$50) Dollars  
For Commercial And Other Bodies Politic Customers**

Whereas, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Folsom recognize the necessity to promote the general welfare by providing sewer improvements which are necessary to meet the increasing demands placed on the system due to the increase in the number of customers, as well as the necessary repairs necessitated by the fact that the sewer system is aging and is in a constant state of transition, and

Whereas, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen are aware of the costs of the necessary repairs as reported by Spangler Engineering in its preliminary report, and

Whereas, the Village of Folsom has been advised by Spangler Engineering that the sewer system is operating at a loss and because the Village is losing revenue because the customers who are not also receiving water from the Village of Folsom are not being charged the minimum rate paid by the customers who receive water and, in addition, because the cost of providing services to the sewer only customers exceed the current rate being charged.

Now Therefore Be It Ordained that the resident customers who receive sewer service only will be charged a rate of thirty dollars (\$30) per month and the commercial and other bodies politic users who receive only sewer service shall be charged fifty dollars (\$50) per month.

Further Be It Ordained that when the rate being charged for customers who receive water from the Village of Folsom exceeds the rate being charged customers who receive sewer only, that the rate paid by sewer customers only will automatically be

increased to equal the minimum rate being charged by customers who receive water. (Reference the schedule provided in Ordinance Chapter 16 – No. 2016-1).

The Foregoing Ordinance was introduced on April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017, notice of public hearing held on May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the title having been read and the ordinance considered, after motion duly made and seconded, a record vote was taken and said vote was as follows:
